

### Why is an Adolescent Country Tracker needed?



- Currently no global framework of outcomes and/or targets for adolescents (10-19 years)
- At country level, no set of indicators against which to measure progress for adolescents
- The ACT aims to provide a common platform for a range of stakeholder to advocate for greater attention and investments in adolescents and track progress at a country level

## Lessons Learned from Piloting the ACT



- Tracker versus Index: Advocacy versus Program Monitoring
- Stimulated discussion on adolescent wellbeing across sectors or ministerial lines
- Raised questions rather than providing answers or solutions
- The link to the SDGs was valued – avoid duplication of efforts
